If you think you may be eligible for 30 hours funded childcare from January 2022 you need to apply for your eligibility code by 31 December 2021. Applications must be made through the HMRC's Childcare Choices website https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/

If you're unable to apply online or have any problems with the application process, please contact HMRC's Childcare Service Customer Interaction Centre on 0300 123 4097 for support.

Please remember you need to renew your code every 3 months to continue claiming the funding.

Lunch Club



Now that the children are settled some parents may like to consider the option of Lunch Club. If so please do speak to your key person. The children must be able to sit at a table for half an hour and to feed themselves.

Eating with other children is a lovely experience which facilitates some great conversation. Payment is by invoice although ad hoc Lunch Clubs, which are welcome, can be paid for using the card reader in the setting. Please also note that once your child is in receipt of the Early Years Free Entitlement Lunch Club may be included in the 15 hours.

NB Please ensure grapes, cherries, cherry tomatoes and strawberries are cut lengthways and then again cut in halves (quarters) to avoid them being a choking hazard. Blueberries should be cut in half.

Please also do not put peanut butter in your child's lunch just in case there are children with undiagnosed allergies to nuts as even remote contact with a child who has been eating peanuts can prove devastating. Please also take food off sticks (mini kebabs).

Footwear and Clothing

Gentle reminders please that inside footwear should be either soft shoes, plimsolls or slippers not trainers or boot shoes unless there are medical reasons.

As the weather is getting cooler and we aim to be outside every day where possible please ensure the children have coats, jumpers and boots with them. We do have some spares but some children don't like to wear clothes other than their own.

Protecting your child against flu

All children aged 2 to 15 years old on 31 August 2021 (and those aged from 6 months onwards in clinical risk groups as well) will be eligible for the free flu vaccination on the NHS this year (2021 to 2022)
